Footwear: All children doing activities require a pair of trainers. Open- toed shoes are not permitted for safety reasons. For children doing water activities, an old pair of trainers is required for use on the lake (children without suitable footwear will not be able to take part in the activities).

Note: Children doing outdoor activities require old clothing: long-sleeved tops and long trousers for most activities, even in the summer months. Children will not be permitted to take part in certain activities if they do not have these. On activity days children require a number of different outfits.

We understand that pupils will want to bring a mobile phone to contact home and take photos as well as other digital devices to keep themselves entertained during the trip; however, they do this at their own risk and need to take care of them during all activities.

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
